Synopsis

He is in a foreign country, he is alone, and he is just a boy. Abbas Kazerooni is not yet ten, but he's suddenly forced to leave his parents, his friends, his entire world and flee Tehran. The Iran-Iraq war is at its bloodiest, and the Ayatollahs who rule Iran have reduced the recruitment age for the army. If Abbas doesn't escape, it's almost certain that he will be drafted and die fighting for a regime that has stripped his family of all they have. On his own in the strange, often frightening city of Istanbul, Abbas grows up fast with little more than his wits to guide him. He must conquer difficult things: how to live on his own, how to navigate a foreign city and culture when he doesn't speak the language, and, most importantly, how to judge who is a friend and who is an enemy. Facing the unexpected as well as the everyday challenges of life on his own, Abbas walks a tightrope of survival, yearning to please the demanding father he has left behind, yet relishing his new found independence. This is the only way he could avoid being conscripted into Iran's army, which has recently reduced the age of recruitment. Already frightened, Kazerooni was pushed beyond all reasonable limits when his mother was denied entry on the plane and he was forced to navigate the trip alone. Here he recalls how he learned to live on his own in a foreign city when he didn't speak the language. His quick thinking and the kindness of strangers allow him to make the best of his dire situation in surprising ways and this memoir is uplifting even when describing the dark times. Kazerooni has written about his trials in order to bring his experiences during the reign of the ayatollahs to many who have limited or no knowledge of that time. I am glad for the epilogue...but would love to know more. A second book to follow up, perhaps? How did his parents get along? How did he do in school? How was it to learn English? And how did he end up in America? This author is VERY talented. The story more than readable. The memory of his experience will last with me.

I enjoyed this book. The writing feels translated to me - a little choppy and doesn't totally flow. HOWEVER, the story is wonderful, and I was so impressed with the presence of mind the author showed when he was younger. The story is very suspenseful even though you know that it had to work out since the author is writing his own story, but he was able to keep the story very suspenseful anyway. I wanted to know what happened after this part - he mentions trouble in boarding school - but I wanted to know about his family and when he saw them again, etc.

This book started out great but quickly turned into a disappointment. By the time I was half way through it the writing turned terrible. It was as though second grader was narrating the book. It

would go something like this: 'I said hello, my name is _____. He said hi, I'm _____. He seemed very nice with kind eyes. So I trusted him.' That was fine once, twice, but this went on with that simple style of writing. I kept thinking it was done to give the thoughts of the child's perspective. But it became unreadable. Eventually I put the book down and didn't finish it.

Based on a true story this is one of the most compelling books I have read. Abbas Kazerooni tells his story when he was 9 years old and had to leave Iran due to the war between Iran and Iraq. He had to leave his parents, his family and everything he knew and loved. His determination and resilience helps him to overcome an almost impossible challenge for an otherwise 9 year old child. His story is breathtaking and inspiring and leaves you with the wish for a continuation of his biography after this book ended.

All I can say is thank you Abbas for a truly inspiring recapture of your amazing journey. I have a friend that is also from Iran and made it out about the same time and is now a successful doctor in the United States. This story will move many people and also inspire them to offer kindness to other people. What an unbelievably brave boy Abbas was. It's amazing what instincts Abbas had at that young age! The author's mother and father did the ultimate sacrifice letting him go. My heart broke for his mother. I know both of them were so proud of their young son. I hope the story continues! I read the whole book today on a rainy day! Great read for everyone.
