

It's a modern take on Good Night Moon in which granny bunny (whom I speculate to be the baby bunny from GNM) gets tired of all the technology and decides to shut 'er down. My little ones especially got a kick out of the "Angry Birds" reference and it's sure to get a chuckle out of anyone who flips through it. Modern wit, humor and a decent point made to anyone who has trouble pulling their face away from that screen.
