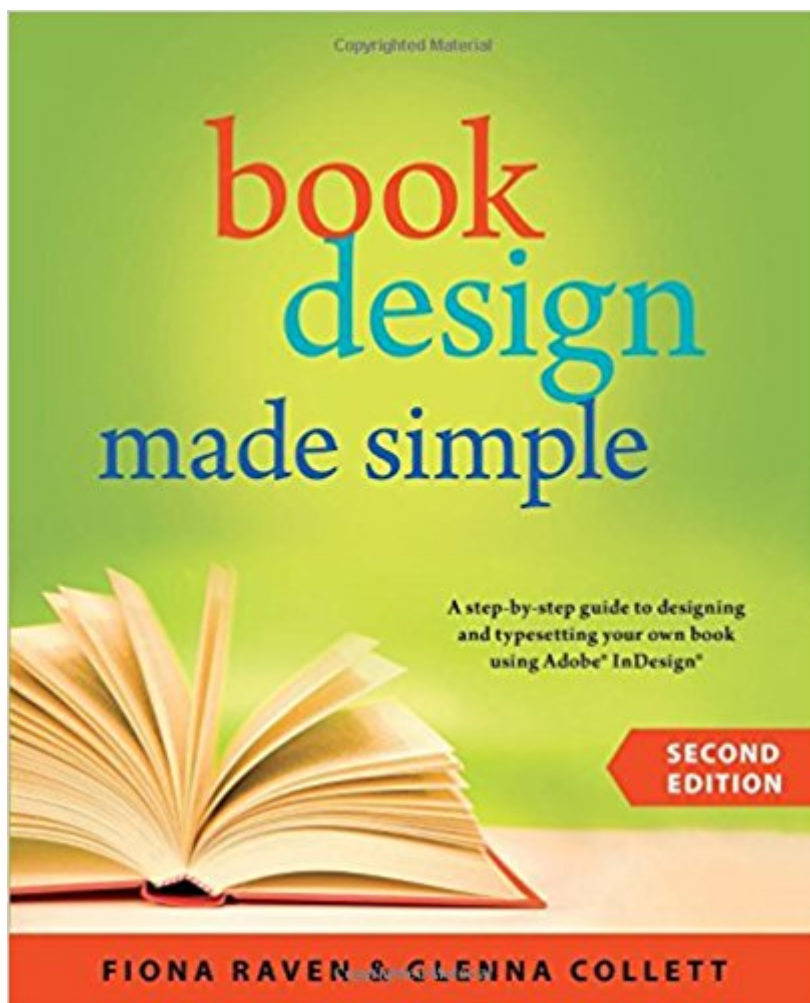

Classic books on book design are fine for design students, but usually have little relation to what we do in today's digital world. What indie authors have wanted – and what they keep asking me for – is step by step instruction in creating industry standard books with today's tools and for today's book production requirements. That's what Book Design Made Simple delivers, and it does so beautifully. But this book is much more than that. Book Design Made Simple is more than an explanation of how to design and produce a book, it's virtually a course in self-publishing, too. Not just the best book about book formatting with InDesign, it is the only book, and so shall remain the only book in its field for years to come. It has everything you need to know, and then some. In fact, one could complain about its information overload. Not that I'm complaining. Yet I must admit I hardly used this book at all. Instead I subscribed to a 10-day free trial to Lynda.com, which has an in-depth series of video tutorials for Adobe InDesign. Upon the 9th day, I canceled, and so did not

pay Lynda a cent. This book did provide me with a sense of security, knowing I could consult it if I so needed. I just never needed. Granted, I already know Adobe Photoshop, so already was familiar with Adobe's interface, tools, language, and navigation, which helped me a lot. If I did not already know Photoshop, I surely would have needed to consult this book.

This will help me complete my book at a fraction of the cost, and I get to keep the file.

I was actually surprised how fantastic a resource (but now how beautifully designed) this book is. I had previously done my book design in Word and was tired of the hours I spent cursing up a blue streak to try to get that annoying son of a sea biscuit to behave. Never again. This book had me up and running with a fully formatted fiction book in a few hours. Seriously, a few hours. AND, I have finally found the program that, with a little creative use of my new knowledge, let's me prepare a paperback and an ebook from the same file. No more exporting in html from Word and importing into Sigil. No more having to change two books if I have to make edits. Nice. I am now reformatting all of my books. If I wasn't also giving them a bit of a copyedit and converting the chapter titles to images, I'd have them formatted in an hour or two each. Since it's a series, I can just pull my styles in from the previous book, and I'm done! Now, don't get the idea that InDesign will never do something untoward. You may have difficulties that the book doesn't immediately address. In that case, there's Google. Or just undo until the problem goes away. Then, go back to the section where you made the mistake and you can learn from your mistake where you varied from the instructions.

Book Design Made Simple by Fiona Raven and Glenna Collett is an invaluable resource for would-be authors contemplating self-publishing. While it is true that anyone can self-publish a book, the reality is that there are many obstacles between the first words on the page and the first copy off the press. Book Design Made Simple is a logical, clearly-written guide to an efficient, organized self-publishing process. It contains practical technical information on how to use the industry-standard publishing platform InDesign to format and assemble a book, design advice to help the author create a polished, aesthetically-pleasing finished product, and a production blueprint to guide the author's development efforts. I purchased a copy of Book Design

Made Simple midway through my own self-publishing process and it has without a doubt helped me create a better-looking, more professional product.

I've published books (for a friend) on CreateSpace and Kindle using MS Word but am new to Adobe InDesign. Tried Adobe's free trial for several days and realized trial-and-error would take too long. This book was the answer and I highly recommend it. One reason I wanted InDesign was the Book Files feature. It allows me to store chapters as separate documents, then automatically combine them to create a book. Book Design Made Simple doesn't cover Book Files but does cover "Creating a separate master page for each chapter" on page 363. I think Book Files is a simpler solution. Adobe has a tutorial on Book Files: [...]
