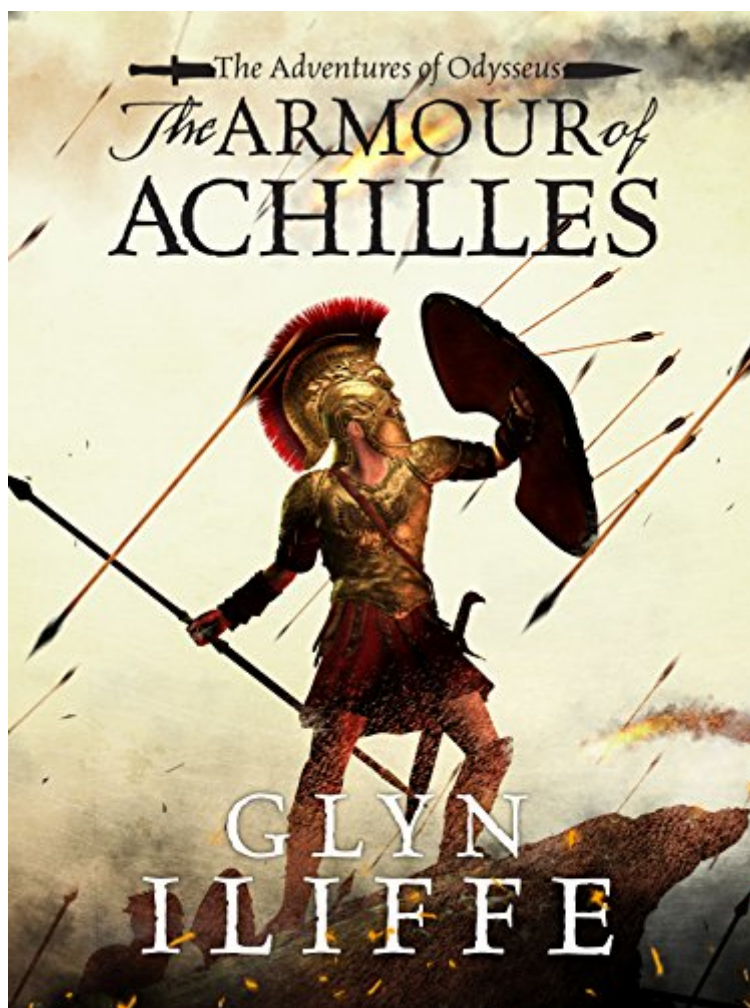

I must say at the outset that anytime an author can take a well known, pretty much been done every which way tale and imbue it with a knack of rekindling interest in the time worn saga, then said author has done something special. This is the third volume in this series and we find our mythic heroes in the tenth year of the war with no end in sight. The main participants, Odysseus, Achilles, Agamemnon, Hector, Helen; well the list goes on. They are brought to life with all of their fears and doubts as well as the twin cornerstones of the conflict, pride and honor. The conflict rages not only on the battlefields but in the hearts and minds of the combatants. So much tension. So many paths and decisions to make. The author has crafted a wonderful take on The Trojan War, a take with many plots and surprises along the way while at the same time replaying the familiar scenes, such as Achilles and Agamemnon's feud or the battle between Achilles and Hector in a way that makes them fresh and exciting. I mark this series as a must read. 5 stars

The writer is clearly talented but it's always difficult to rekindle interest in a story everyone knows so well. The addition of imaginary characters like Aeneas and Euryalus adds some new glow to an old otherwise worn out epic, and the part about Ajax going mad is very well executed. Having said that bcuz there is little new, i would prefer novels from other series rather than reading more of this one.

The mythical Greek siege of Troy is long and presents a real challenge for an author retelling it. But Iliffe does a good job, keeping it interesting with fascinating characters and some unexpected turns of events. The ordinary and human is deftly mixed with the heroic and supernatural. Of course,

these books should be read in order. Eagerly awaiting (2104) the last instalment.
