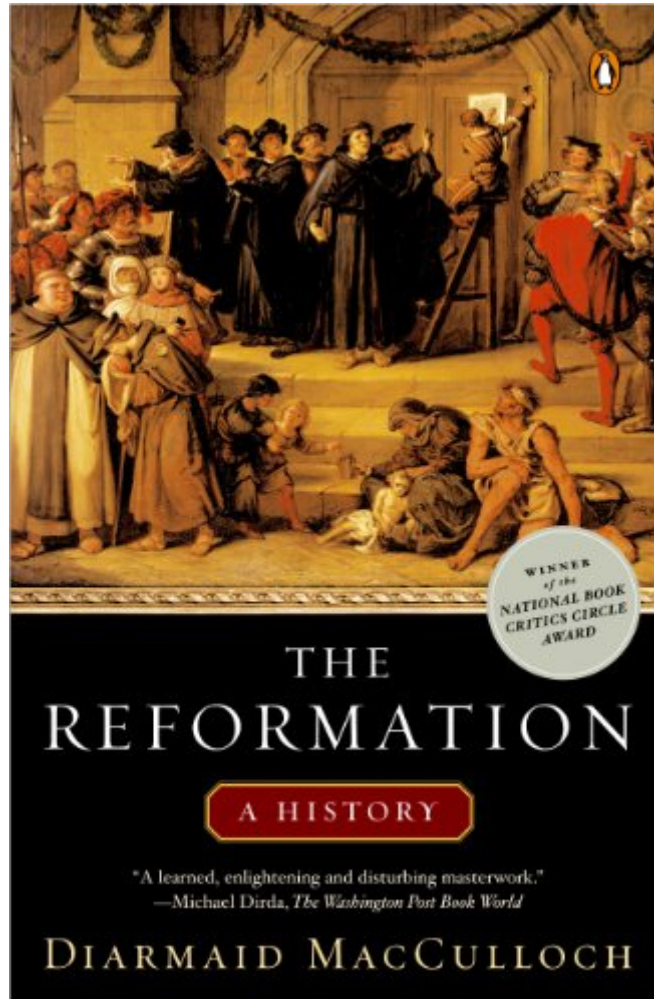

This is an expansive and thoroughly useful guide to the European Reformation. It begins with a brief discussion on pre-Reformation Europe from political, social and religious angles, with a particular focus on the growth of humanism led by Erasmus. Ensuing chapters are arranged chronologically, geographically and topically according to the three parts of the book. This multifaceted view is very helpful in giving a broad understanding of the various factors at play in the Reformation, and their interactions. This book would make an excellent core text for Reformation study, to be expanded through more specialist texts on particular topics. The Kindle version of this book is very well done. The contents page is fully indexed, including sub-headings within chapters, making for easy browsing.
