

This is a concise, helpful reference primer that's well-thought out and has wide and appropriate

topic coverage in the nexus between philosophy and theology, which is useful when you need a quick, clear, uncomplicated overview. The minor issue I have with my Kindle version is that (at the moment) the hot-links from the Contents page don't quite match the results: they land on a prior page to the subject I'm after. This ought not hinder anyone from buying this otherwise excellent little book.
