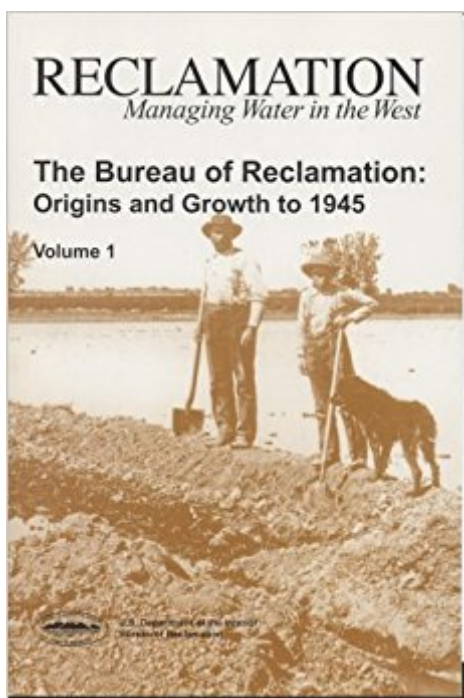


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The Bureau Of Reclamation: Origins And Growth To 1945, Volume 1



Synopsis

The illustrated story that runs through the chapters of this first volume addresses the origins and implementation of what was to be called "reclamation" under the auspice and financing of a government service bureau.Â These pages look at the origins of Reclamation as an ambitious experiment or innovation in government land policies that from the beginning of the Republic sought to dispose of the Public Domain. Western lands without access to water seemed of little value, but once water and land could be joined, land became valuable.Â In many places the Bureau of Reclamation became the agency of this transformation.Â Arid public lands that obtained water rights became attractive land for settlement and private acquisition.Â The entire effort of "federal reclamation by irrigation" was a vast experiment ranging from the construction of minor to enormous multipurpose water projects that ultimately did far more than provide water for irrigation agriculture. This book is for someone who seriously wants to understand the roots and growth of the bureau of reclamation over it's formative years. There are points through out to think about - what role Theodore Roosevelt and the conservationists of the era thought about conservation, the political (and not just economic) reasons for damming rivers in the west, and one can always think about the hubris of man in "taming nature".It touches on some of the controversies but doesn't dig deeply - it's not so much a critique of the bureau as it is a straightforward history. If you are looking for some of the more inflammatory portions of the history of water reclamation in the west, I'd recommend Caddilac Desert, A River No More, and the like.In all, a fair, factual and straightforward review of the bureau's history.
